#### **Experimental learning method-**

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#### **Technology and Infrastructure Overview of the Institution**

The institution boasts state-of-the-art Information and Communication Technology (ICT) infrastructure, creating a fully internet- and Wi-Fi-enabled campus that supports academic and administrative operations. Equipped with 41 computers, the setup ensures seamless digital integration. Among these, 3 high-performance systems are dedicated to office operations, all supported by internet and Wi-Fi connectivity. Regular upgrades ensure these systems meet the evolving demands of the institution for optimal efficiency.

### **Library and ICT Facilities**

The institution's technological infrastructure caters to modern academic needs, fostering excellence and digital learning. The library includes 3 computers one for student use and 2 for staff, all internet-enabled to provide smooth access to e-resources. A dedicated ICT lab features 30 computers exclusively for student use, promoting research, skill development, and collaboration. Additionally, the Computer cum Smart Teaching Hub integrates a smart board, server, and systems interconnected via Local Area Network (LAN) and internet, enabling interactive and engaging teaching. Together, these resources enhance academic research, learning, and digital literacy.

### **Educational Technology and Accessibility**

To enrich the teaching-learning process, the institution integrates Educational Technology (ET) tools. With LAN and broadband connectivity spanning the office, library, and computer lab, students and staff utilize resources for activities such as web browsing, downloading, uploading, and blogging. These tools support PowerPoint presentations, seminars, and assignments, while fostering the creation of teaching-learning materials and ICT skill development. This dynamic environment enhances both curricular and co-curricular engagements, preparing students for future challenges.

### **Software and E-Learning Tools**

A variety of software solutions, including Windows 7 and 10, MS Office (2007, 2013, and 2016), Adobe Reader, and Vriddhi software, are employed to streamline academic and administrative functions. During the COVID-19 pandemic, conferencing tools ensured uninterrupted online learning. Currently, students practice ICT skills in the computer lab using MS Office 2013. These tools, combined with advanced elearning platforms, promote collaborative learning and enhance student preparedness for academic and professional success.

# IT Infrastructure and Management

The institution's robust IT infrastructure includes 13 battery backups (9 old, 4 new), 3 Salvo Invertors, 1 Urja Vision Invertor, and 1 Microtek Invertor to ensure uninterrupted power supply, along with 3 Wi-Fi routers for seamless connectivity. Campus security is reinforced with 14 CCTV cameras, including in the computer lab and library passage. ICT resources include 15 pen drives, 1 HP Smart Tank 525 colour

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printer, 5 Canon black-and-white printers. Interactive teaching tools like 2 overhead projectors, 1 smart board, and 1 electronic punching machine enhance operational efficiency. With 30 desktop computers 20 new and 10 older systems featuring Intel Core i5, i3, and i7 8th generation processors the institution ensures diverse academic capabilities. A high-speed 200 Mbps connection, secured by a hardware firewall, enables safe, efficient internet access. IT services, managed by Gazon Communications and supported by Infosoft Solutions, ensure smooth functionality and an updated digital presence under expert guidance.

The institution ensures financial transparency and accountability through systematic internal and external audits conducted over the last six years. To achieve this, & Associates Chartered Accountants has been appointed as the internal auditor. The financial statements, including books of account, vouchers, and related documents, are meticulously maintained and audited annually. The last internal audit was conducted during the financial year \_2023-24\_\_\_\_ and completed in \_\_\_2024\_\_\_, with its report submitted to the college management for review and necessary action.

The college receives financial support in various forms, including salary and development grants for grant-in-aid courses from the Government of Maharashtra. Additionally, it benefits from grants sanctioned under special schemes by the University Grants Commission (UGC) and the Board of College and University Development (BCUD), Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune. Funds are allocated for specific purposes such as infrastructure development, departmental renovation, and administrative enhancements.

Procurement of materials and services is executed with utmost transparency. The college adheres to a three-quotation system, ensuring orders are placed with vendors offering the best combination of quality, price, and service. All accounts are managed by a designated accountant in compliance with established financial norms. The Principal oversees daily collections, endorsing cash balances at the close of each day.

External audits are conducted by the Joint Director of Higher Education, Pune Region, and the Account Officer, Higher Education Department, Pune Region. These audits ensure adherence to guidelines from Savitribai Phule Pune University, UGC, and the Government of Maharashtra. Funds forwarded to the institution under programs such as the National Service Scheme (NSS) and examination-related activities undergo strict scrutiny by these external bodies.

The audit mechanisms include verification of teaching and administrative staff salary grants forwarded by the government, as well as funds allocated for education and other development initiatives. Internal audits, performed by the appointed auditors, focus on streamlining financial procedures and maintaining compliance with institutional and governmental requirements.

Over the past five years, the institution has consistently conducted these audits to meet regulatory standards, identify discrepancies, and implement corrective measures. The teaching-learning process and its methodology are systematically reviewed through meetings involving the Head of the Department, committee heads, and administrative staff by the IQAC, adhering to established norms.

Each year, departments organize study tours to enhance student learning. For instance, F.Y., S.Y., and T.Y.
